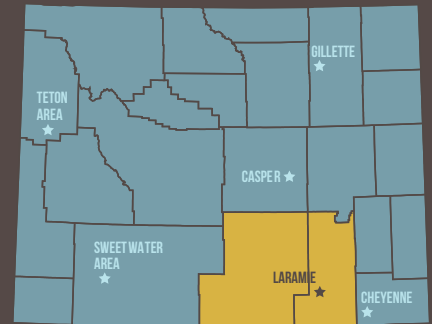
“I wanted to be there for my daughter but was afraid I didn’t have the skills. Climb gave me the chance to practice, and I am proud to realize I had it in me.”
