A STEPPING STONE TO SUCCESS

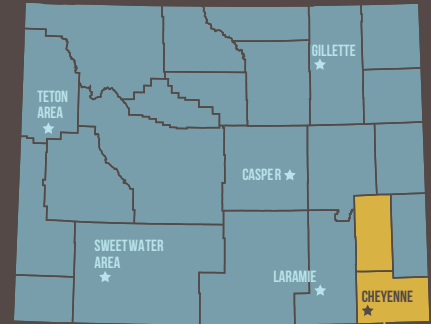
