### THE JOURNEY OUT OF POVERTY

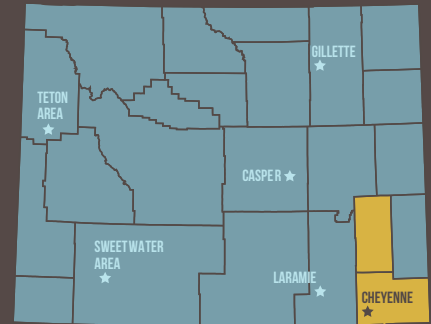
