BUILDING TRUST

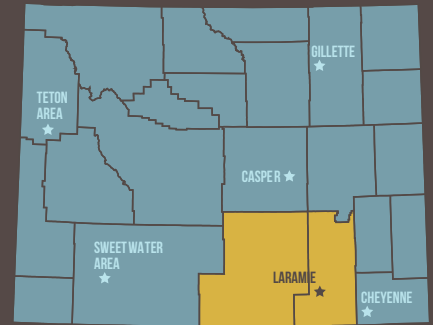

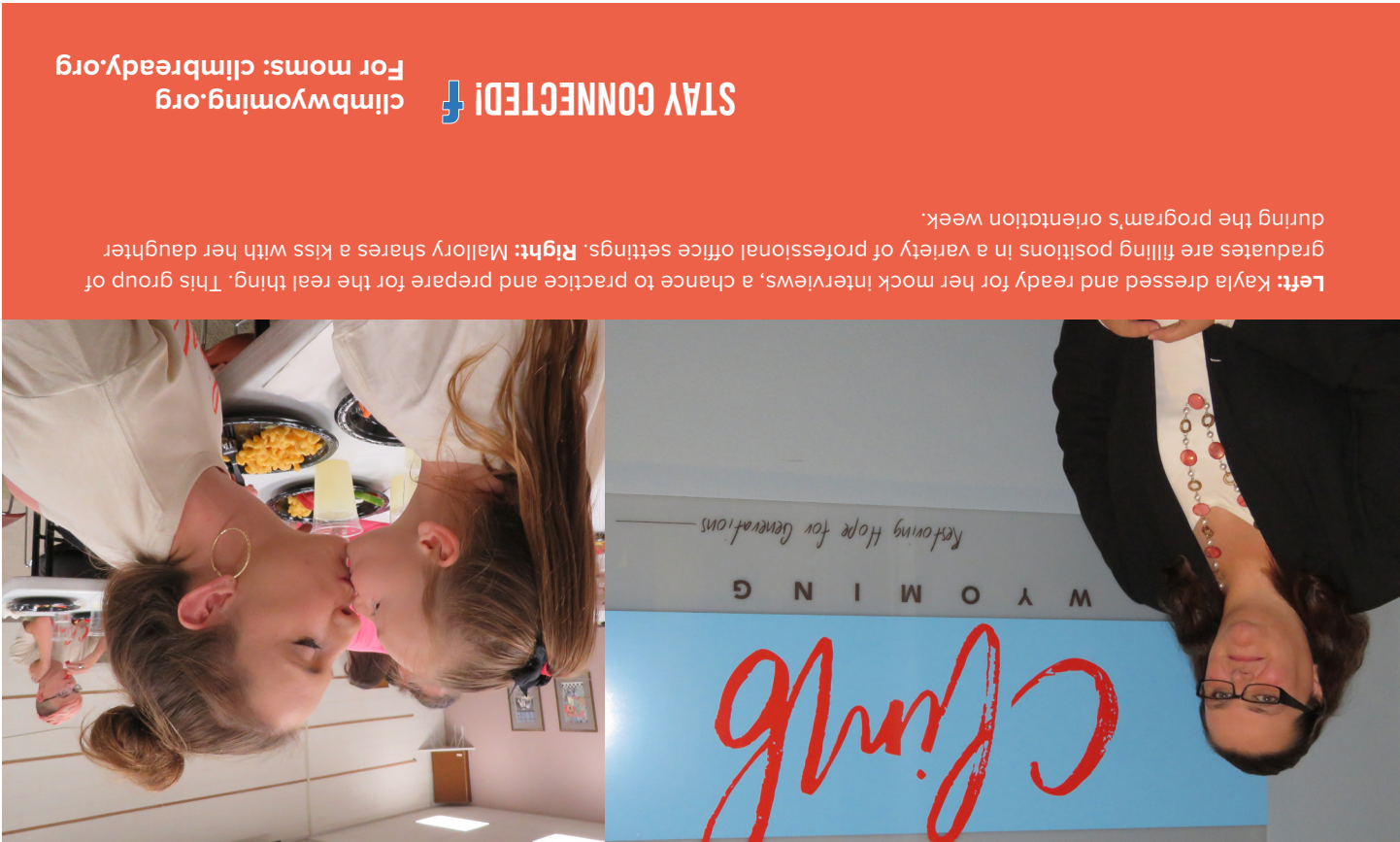
